ABSTRACT

Herbal formulations are commonly prescribed by Ayurveda physicians. They are having least side effects. Kashaya is one such preparation which has water soluble extracts of multiple herbal ingredients. *Panchatikta kashaya* is a decoction of five bitter herbs – *Guduchi(Tinosporia cordifolia)*, *Vasaka(Adhatoda vasica)*, *Katuki (Picrorhiza kurroa)*, *Bhunimba (Andrographis paniculata) and Nimba twak (Azadirachta indica)*. *These drugs are having tikta rasa* (bitter taste), *laghu* (light) *rooksha*(rough) *guna, dipana*(appetizer), *pachana*(digestives), *pittahara*, *krimighna* (killing of worms / parasites), *raktashodhska* (blood purifier) *and kaphapitta nashaka action*. It is indicated in *Kasa*(cough), *Shwasa*(bronchial asthma), *Jwara*(fever), *Krimi*(worms), *madhumeha* (diabetes), *kushtha*(skin diseases), *sthoulya*(obesity), *Vatarakta and pittaja disorders*. *Panchatikta kashaya* can be given in multiple diseases with suitable adjuvant Ayurveda formulations which are disease specific in action. The present paper highlights about the clinical indications of *Panchatikta kashaya* in a scientific and experiential view.

INTRODUCTION

Panchatikat Kashayam is a very famous Ayurvedic medicine used in fever, skin diseases, and is potent antiviral and antibacterial herb. It is also known as panchatikta kashyam, panchtikta kashya. It is made of five herbal ingredients and is bitter in taste. so, the name Panchatikat. Panchatikta kashaya is a decoction of five bitter herbs – Guduchi (Tinosporia cordifolia), Vasaka (Adhatoda vasica), Katuki (Picrorhiza kurroa), Bhunimba (Andrographis paniculata) and Nimba twak (Azadirachta indica). Panchtikta Kashyam mainly pacifies pitta. It also helps to eliminate the toxins in the body. It is considered Ayurvedic Broad spectrum antiviral, antibacterial, antiviral and anti-inflammatory medicine.

DISCUSSION

Panchatikta kashaya is consisting of bitter drugs which are given in various kapha pittaja diseases. Most of them are ushna virya (hot potency) and raktashodhska (blood purifier), krimighna (killing 1 of worms / parasites),antibacterial , anti-infective bactericidal and immunomodulator in action. They are given in various *kapha pittaja* diseases and skin diseases. However, because of bitter taste it is not palatable in children.

- 1. Jwara (Fever)- It is given with mrityunjaya rasa or tribhuvana kirti rasa.
- 2. Kasa (Cough)- It is giver with sitopaladi choorna 9. Anorexia It is given with lashunadi vati and or talisadi choorna.
- 3. Shwasa (Bronchial asthma)- It is given with shwasa kuthara rasa, talisadi choorna and kanakasava.
- 4. Krimi (Worms) It is given with krimikuthara rasa.
- 5. Madhumeha (Diabetes)- It is given with Vasanta kusumakara rasa, and chandraprabha vati.
- 6. Sthoulya (Obesity) It is given with navaka guggulu or amritadi guggulu and tryushanadi louha.

7. Kushtha (Skin diseases) – It is given with

khadirarishtha.

8. Contact dermatitis – It is given with arogyavardhini vati and mahamanjishtadi kashaya

- lavana bhaskara choorna.
- 10. **Indigestion** It is given with *Lashunadi vati and* Kupiluhingwadi vati.
- 11. Chronic bronchitis It is given with Vrinapahari rasa , mrityunjaya rasa and talisadi choorna .
- 12. **Pneumonia** It is given with *Sheetamshu rasa*, talisadi choorna, and tribhuvana kirthi rasa.
- 13. **Bronchial bronchial asthma** It is given with Somasava, mrityunjaya rasa, and talisadi choorna.
- 14. Worm infestation in children It is given with Krimikuthara rasa and Vidangarishta.
- panchanimbadi choorna, arogyavardhini rasa and 15. Pratishyaya (Allergic rhinitis) It is given with

Naradiya laxmivilasa rasa .

- 16. **Peenasa** (Sinusitis)– It is given with *mrityunjaya* rasa a d mahalaxmi vilasa rasa.
- 17. *Kshavathu* (sneezing) It is given with *tribhuvana kirthi rasa*.
- 18. **Peripheral vascular disease** It is given with *Mahamanjishtadi kashaya* and *shiva gutika*.
- 19. **Deep vein thrombosis** It is given with *guggulu tiktaka kashaya and shilajatwadi lowha*.
- 20. Cellulitis It is given with mahamanjishtadi kashaya and Laghu sootha shekhara vati
- 21. Chronic non healing ulcer It is given with chandraprabha vati, Asanadi kashaya and Pravala panchamrita rasa.
- 22. Urticaria It is given with laghu sootha shekhara vati and Haridra khanda .
- 23. Psoriasis It is given with Strikutaja taila for

external application and dinamallika taila to application as well as internally.

- 24. **Scabies** It is given with *Gandhaka rasayana and gandhaka malahara* externally .
- 25. Eczyma It is given with Mahamanjishtadi kashaya, Arogyavardhini vati rasamanikya
 .Mahamarichyadi taila external application.
- 26. Furunculosis It is given with arogyavardhini vati and mahatiktaka kashaya.
- 27. Sheetapitta (Urticaria) It is given with Laghu sootha shekhara vati and Sarivadyasava.
- 28. **Paronychia** It is given with Gandhaka rasayana and Karpooradi malahara externally.
- 29. Taenia cruris, Taenia capitis, Taenia corporis -It is given with gandhaka rasayana and mahatiktaka kashaya internally and nayapamaradi taila externally.

CONCLUSION

- 1. *Panchatikta kashaya* is made up of 5 bitter drugs and is given in *kapha pittaja* diseases and disorders of the skin.
- 2. There are least side effects after the administration of this formulation even after for prolonged period .
- 3. Sometimes constipation is seen in some patients after consuming the formulation .
- 4. With suitable adjuvants , panchatikta kashaya can be given in various disorders with better outcome .
